Here is Honor-Mae's winning poem, inspired by Seamus Heaney's poem *Digging*, which explores the relationship between the poet and his ancestors. In the same way, Honor-Mae's poem explores *Connections*, the theme of this year's Rotary Young Writer's Competition:

Connections

For six hundred years we've ploughed the fields. We've sown the seed and harvested The field, from dawn to dusk, In the rain, wind and sun.

We've tended our crops By hand, horse, machine, And blessed the plough On October's eves.

From father to son, From boy to man, The traditions of the land Have been passed hand to hand.

The cattle we've herded, The flocks we've watched, From Shropshire to Warwickshire With just a few stops.

The traditions of farming, They run through our veins They never retire, They die of old age.
